

ABOUT ALLEGHENY LAND TRUST



- Allegheny Land Trust (a local non-profit conservation organization)
- Working in cooperation with local community members to acquire and permanently conserve one of the largest remaining green spaces in Pittsburgh's eastern suburbs
- For the health, well-being, and enjoyment of current and future residents and to enhance the long-term attractiveness and viability of local municipalities



ABOUT ALLEGHENY LAND TRUST









PROPERTY DETAILS



- 148 acres (108 in Churchill, 40 acres in Penn Hills)
- ten individual and adjacent parcels
- abandoned as a country club approximately ten years ago
- reverting to natural green space and is now home to many species of native flora and fauna
- rare oasis in densely populated area (95,000 people live within a three-mile radius)
- adjacent to many residential streets and within walking distance of several thousand neighbors
- area residents are informally using the area for passive recreation due to its surprising beauty, easy and safe accessibility (former golf cart paths), and proximity to their homes
- bisected by Chalfant Run-a mine drainage impaired tributary of flood prone Turtle Creek
- adjacent to the 15-acre Bullock Pens Park (Churchill)
- currently owned by real estate development company Zokaites
 Properties

COMMUNITY BENEFITS





- provide permanent, close to home, easily-accessible place for outdoor recreation and exercise
- preserve natural scenic beauty
- enhance attractiveness of the municipality for prospective young homeowners ("proximity to open space" is cited as a key factor in their consideration of where to buy a home)
- increased property values (+5%-30% based on distance from green space) and thus tax revenue
- create a unique resource for environmental education for students and the community at large
- sequester rainwater to help mitigate downstream flooding
- help with the Municipalities' MS4 pollution abatement requirements

CURRENT PROJECT STATUS



- Allegheny Land Trust (ALT) has an agreement to purchase the property contingent upon its
 ability to raise necessary funding by the targeted end-of-year closing date.
- Discussions are underway with municipalities, community groups, and other interested parties to gauge interest, gain input and align support.
- ALT has initiated grant requests to cover a portion of the acquisition costs and is continuing to seek and apply for other sources of grant funding and will soon launch a community fundraising campaign to close the funding gap.
